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What is this product?

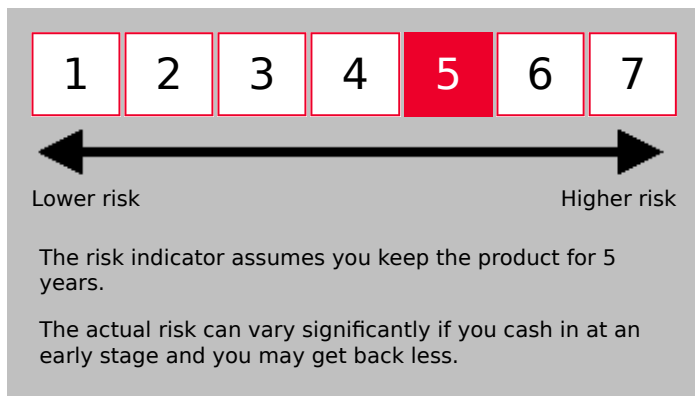
Type The Company was incorporated in England and Wales on 7 October 2016 with registered number 10415235 as a public company limited by shares under the Companies Act 2016. The principal legislation under which the Company operates is the Companies Act 2006. The Company is a closed ended company listed on the London Stock Exchange.

Objectives The investment objective of the Company is to provide Shareholders with capital growth and income over the long term, through investment in listed or quoted global healthcare companies. The Company's specific return objectives are: (i) to beat the total return of the MSCI World Healthcare Index (in sterling) on a rolling 3 year period (the index total return including dividends reinvested on a net basis); and (ii) to seek to generate a double-digit total shareholder return per annum over a rolling 3 year period.

Intended retail investor The Ordinary Shares available under the Share Issuance Programme are designed to be suitable for institutional investors and professionally-advised private investors seeking exposure to global healthcare equities. The Ordinary Shares may also be suitable for investors who are financially sophisticated, non-advised private investors who are capable of evaluating the risks and merits of such an investment and who have sufficient resources to bear any loss which may result from such an investment. What are the risks and what could I get in return?
